Duties	<p>You will be required to teach:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stylistic Composition: Techniques of Composition (Year 1, Compulsory course) and where required in Years 2 and 3, a particular interest in jazz is welcome.• Optional Composition courses for students in Years 1-3 <p>Stylistic Composition (Techniques of Composition) includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Counterpoint (sixteenth-century two and three-part); Baroque instrumental counterpoint in three parts.• Harmony: String Quartet; Piano accompaniment for a solo vocal line; Jazz Lead sheet realisation• Final year options in Techniques add fugue and sonata <p>Competency in piano would also be an advantage.</p> <p>There will also be opportunities for you to teach other optional courses within your area of expertise.</p> <p>You will be required to provide teaching for an average of three hours' contact time per week during the eight weeks of term. All of our teaching is in small groups (usually one or two students).</p> <p>You will also be expected to set and mark weekly work, set and mark college exams (collections), participate in arranging teaching and contribute to undergraduate admissions in November and December, including the interviews.</p> <p>More detailed duties are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Organising and delivering the teaching of Pembroke College undergraduates in the relevant subjects• Setting and marking Collections (internal College exams) to a deadline in 2nd week of term.• Writing end of term reports on the performance of your undergraduates using the web-based system, TMS.
